#### **MAY MEETING**

Our chairman, Bruce, started the meeting by introducing one of our speakers, Val Fendley, as the newly elected Mayor of Ramsey. Congratulations and applause followed. He then went on to draw attention to the Meet & Greet for new members, which is being held on Friday 17th May. On behalf of the travel committee, Jane then updated members on what they are hoping to offer in 2025. Two holidays, one to South Devon and one to the Isle of Wight plus Three day trips to Greenwich, Bury St Edmunds & Sutton Hoo and Lincoln. Possibly a Christmas market option as well.

It was then the turn of our speakers, Alison Seery and Val from the Ramsey Neighbourhood Trust (RNT) to talk about how it was formed from lottery funding in 2012 known as the Ramsey Millions. Eventually becoming a charity in 2019. Many community based groups and activities have sprung from this with the Ramsey Community Support Hub in the library offering lots of help and support ranging from job searches to bus & blue badge assistance. SPARKS for people with additional needs, BOSH for 4-10 years and CRUNCH for 11-17 years. They highlighted the fact that although volunteers are wonderful and they couldn't do without them, paid skilled staff are always needed and funding is in short supply. There is also a Youth Café, which



has benefitted from PCC funding and a Dog Café held in the Pavilion. Additional trustees are needed for the RNT charity if any members are interested in helping. Facebook is one way of keeping up to date with what is going on and there is always a report on progress in The Fens magazine.
